BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Policy -- purpose. (1) It is the declared policy of this state to foster and support a sound economy that will provide improved opportunities for the employment of its citizens, promote the development of its natural resources, and provide the people of Montana with a greater assurance of industrial and commercial stability.

(2) It is the purpose of [this act] to provide remedies to those who suffer damages or harm as a result of delays in or interference with industrial or commercial development. construction. or operation in this state. if the person or persons causing the delay or interference did so without good cause.

23 Section 2. Definitions. As used in [this act] the 24 following definitions apply:

(1) "Person" means any individual, firm, partnership,

company, association, corporation, city, town, government entity, or any other government or private entity, whether organized for profit or not.

(2) "Good cause" means a lawful objective or privilege or right pursued in a manner prescribed by law, and specifically includes any labor-management dispute. In any proceeding under [this act] the question of good cause shall be determined by the court.

Section 3. Pecuniary liability -- injunction. Any person who delays or interferes with any industrial or commercial development, construction, or operation in this state without good cause is liable to persons injured thereby for all damages sustained and may be enjoined from continuing such action if the court finds that irreparable harm may result.

16 Section 4. Penalty. Any person who delays or interferes with any industrial or commercial development, 17 construction, or operation in this state without good cause 18 19 is subject to a fine not to exceed \$1,000 or imprisonment 20 not to exceed 30 days, or both.
