11	Section 1. Section 41-3-502, MCA, is amended to read:
12	*41-3-502. License required. No person shall maintain
13	or operate a foster or boarding home for any child or
14	children within the meaning of this chapter without first
15	securing a license in writing from the department of social
15	and rehabilitation services or the department of
17	institutions. The foster or boarding home may apply to the
13	agency of its choice for licensure. No fee shall be charged
19	for such license."
20	Section 2. Section 41-3-503, MCA, is amended to read:
21	#41-3-503. Issuance of license authority of issuing
22	agency. The department of social and rehabilitation services
23	is and the department of institutions are hereby authorized

to issue licenses to persons conducting boarding or foster

homes and to prescribe the conditions upon which such

Ł licenses shall be issued and to make such rules as it may 2 deem consider advisable for the operation and regulation of 3 foster and boarding homes for minor children consistent with the welfare of such children. Such licensing agency shall have the power and authority to inspect all such licensed foster and boarding homes through its duly authorized representatives and to cancel licenses theretofore issued for the failure to observe such rules. The person operating such homes shall give to such representative such 10 information as may be required and afford him every reasonable facility for observing the operation of such 11 12 homes. Ine licensing agency may not prescribe the 13 child-raising philosophy to be used by any foster home or 14 private institution. The licensing agency may require the 15 operator of the foster home or private institution to state 16 in writing his purposes, goals, and child-rearing practices 17 prior\_to\_issuance\_of\_the\_license.\_ The\_rules\_promulgated\_by 18 an agency apply only to foster homes or private institutions
