Description of Proposed Legislation

A proposal to increase the silicosis benefit payments from \$175 per month to \$400 on persons and surviving spouses of persons having contracted silicosis, also increasing the benefit payments of surviving spouses whose spouse died prior to March 14, 1974.

Assumptions

- 1. The number of persons participating in the program will continue to decline as currently estimated.
- 2. The elimination of the \$6,800 taxable income provision is Section 4 will not appreciably effect the number of persons qualifying for the program.
- 3. Administrative costs will not increase.
