9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
10 Section 1. Short title. [This act] may be cited as the
11 "Taxpayers" Lobbyist Disclosure Act of 1981".

12 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of [this act] is to 13 inform municipal taxpayers of the costs incurred by the 14 municipality in making payments to lobbying organizations 15 and to provide the electorate the option, exercisable at a 16 general election, to authorize or disapprove of payments of 17 public funds to such organizations.

18 Section 3. Definition. "Lobbying organization", as 19 used in [this act], means a private association or 20 organization whether incorporated or not that employs or 21 reimburses expenses for a licensed lobbyist who primarily 22 represents the interests of local governments, their 23 governing bodies, or officers.

24 Section 4. Payment of public funds to lobbying 25 organization -- vote required. (1) A municipality may not pay public funds to a lobbying organization unless authorized to do so by a vote of the municipality's electorate at a general election. The ballot issue on payment authorization must state the amount the municipality proposes to pay to the lobbying organization. The payment is authorized if a majority of the electors voting on the question approve the payment.

8 (2) The authorization for payment of public funds to a
9 lobbying organization has continuing validity unless the
10 amount to be paid increases more than 3% in any year.

11 Section 5. Increase in fees -- vote to authorize. A municipality authorized to pay public funds to a lobbying 12 13 organization under [section 4] may not increase its payment to the lobbying organization by more than 3% annually unless 14 15 such an expenditure is authorized by a vote of the municipality's electorate at a general election. The ballot 16 17 issue on the payment increase authorization must state the 18 amount paid the lobbying organization the previous year, the 19 total amount of the proposed payment authorization, and the 20 percentage increase between the two amounts. The increased 21 payment is authorized if a majority of the electors voting 22 on the question approve the payment.
