4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO CLARIFY WHO MAY 5 AUTHORIZE A PUBLIC DISPLAY OF FIREWORKS; AMENDING SECTION 6 50-37-107, MCA."

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9 Section 1. Section 50-37-107, MCA, is amended to read: 10 \*50-37-107. Supervised public display of fireworks 11 authorized. (1) The state fire marshal and or the governing body of a city, town, or county may, under reasonable rules 12 13 adopted by them, grant permits for supervised public displays of fireworks to be held by municipalities, fair 14 15 associations, amusement parks, and other organizations or 16 groups of individuals.

17 (2) Each display shall:

(a) be handled by a competent operator, who must be
approved by the state fire marshal or the governing body of
the municipality in which the display is to be held; and

(b) be located, discharged, or fired as, in the
opinion of the chief of the fire department or other officer
designated by the governing body of the municipality after
proper inspection, not to be hazardous to persons or
property.

(3) Application for permits shall be made in writing
 at least 15 days prior to the date of the display.

3 (4) After the privilege has been granted, sales, 4 possession, use, and distribution of fireworks for the 5 display are lawful for that purpose only.

6 (5) No permit granted under this section is7 transferable.

3 (6) The term "municipalities" includes cities and

9 incorporated towns."
