No voucher or payment may be made to a county for lands owned by the department and used exclusively for game bird farms or fish hatcherys or administrative purposes or 10 lands-administered-with-money-from-the-general-fund." 11

Description of Proposed Legislation

An act to provide for payment in lieu of taxes on real estate improvements owned by the Department of Fish, Wildlife & Parks.

Assumptions

- 1. Value of improvements on wildlife management areas not available but assumed to exceed \$1,000,000 which was used as a minimum.
- 2. Value of improvements on all park and recreation areas not available but assumed to exceed \$2,000,000 which was used as a minimum.
- 3. All improvements Class 4 with 8.55% taxable value.
- 4. An average levy of 250 mills is assumed.
- 5. The effect of the change to "fair market value" appraisal of lands is indeterminable but has potential of large expenditure increase.
- 6. It is assumed the Department of Fish, Wildlife & Parks would be responsible to inventory, evaluate, and voucher all improvements.
- 7. Personal services based on 11.8% established overhead rate.
- 8. 10% escalation of improvement value in 1983.
- 9. Wildhorse Island land appraisal assumed at \$3,000,000.
- 10. \$500,000 valuation land improvements at Lewis and Clark Caverns.

The Department of Fish, Wildlife & Parks will need an increase of \$90,540 in FY 1982 and \$100,235 in FY 1983 from general funds to meet the increased tax burden. These amounts however, will be made available to those taxing jurisdictions whose revenues are derived from property taxes.
