A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO REQUIRE THAT A MAJORITY OF THE PROPERTY OWNERS CONCUR IN THE NOMINATION OF THEIR PROPERTY BY THE HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICER AS A HISTORIC DISTRICT; AMENDING SECTION 22-3-431, MCA."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 22-3-431, MCA, is amended to read:

"22-3-431. Registration of heritage properties. (1)

Any citizen of Montana may submit to the historic

preservation officer for his consideration the necessary

forms to nominate heritage properties to the register.

(2) For properties not owned by the state, the historic preservation officer may, upon approval by the preservation review board and after-written-deproval-by-the fundowner with the written concurrence of the owner or owners of the property, nominate heritage properties to the register. In the case of a historic district, the historic preservation officer may nominate the property only with the concurrence of a majority of the property owners of the district.

24 (3) For lands owned by the state, the historic 25 preservation officer may, upon approval by the preservation

review board, nominate heritage properties to the register. The historic preservation officer shall notify the appropriate state agency and give public notice when any property is being considered for nomination. Unless state agency or public objections are submitted in writing within days after notification, the historic preservation officer shall complete the nominations. When a state agency 7 or any citizen of Montana submits written objections, the historic preservation officer shall consider the objections 10 and may conduct a public hearing. If a hearing is held, it 11 shall be commenced within 30 days after the final date for submission of written objections. Within 60 days after 12 submission of the objections or after the public hearing. 13 the historic preservation officer shall make a final 14 decision on the proposed registration and prepare a 15 statement responsive to the objections submitted." 16
