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Description of Proposed Legislation:

House Bill 472 provides for a two mill maximum levy on livestock to fund veterinary inspections at livestock markets.

### Assumptions:

- 1. The taxable value of livestock will continue at the 1980 calendar year value.
- 2. The mill levy for general operations of the Animal Health Division will continue at 15 mills.
- 3. The maximum levy of 2 mills for veterinary inspections will be levied.
- 4. Total time for veterinary inspection at markets will be 5200 hours each year at \$25.00 per hour.
- 5. Expenditures under current law reflects all program budgets funded by ERA 02151.
- 6. There is no funding for market health inspection in the budget approved by the Appropriations Subcommittee.
- 7. A new Earmarked Revenue Account will be established specifically for the revenue generated by HB 472.

### Revenue and Expenditure Impact:

Revenue: A two mill levy on livestock with a taxable value of \$83,900,858 will generate a total of \$167,803 in revenue each year.

Expenditures: The cost of veterinary inspections at livestock markets, based on 5,200 hours at \$25.00 per hour will cost \$130,000 each year.

#### Comments:

The cost of veterinary market inspections is not included in the Disease Control budget for fiscal years 1982 and 1983 as approved by the Appropriations Subcommittee. Therefore, should this bill or one similar become law the Disease Control budget should be increased by \$130,000 each year of the biennium.
