8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9 Section 1. Section 13-10-601, MCA, is amended to read:

10 *13-10-601. Parties eligible for primary election ==

11 petitions by minor parties. (1) Every political party that

12 had a candidate for a statewide office who received a total

13 vote that was 5% or more of the total votes cast for the

14 successful candidate for governor at the last general

15 election shall nominate its candidates for public office,

16 except for presidential electors, by a primary election as

17 provided in this chapter.

(2) A political party that does not qualify to hold a primary election under subsection (1) may qualify to nominate its candidates by primary election by presenting a petition, in a form prescribed by the secretary of state, requesting the primary election and signed by a number of registered voters equal to 5% or more of the total votes cast for the successful candidate for governor at the last general election. The petition shall be filed with the

2 even-numbered year."
