10	Section 1. Section 20-9-353, MCA, is amended to read:

13	any district may propose to adopt a general fund budget in

15	as established by the schedules in 20-9-316 through 20-9-321

(2) However, when the trustees adopt a total general

fund budget which exceeds 110% of the general fund budget

increase with the superintendent of public instruction, setting forth the specific reasons for increasing the budget. (3) When the trustees of any district determine that an additional amount of financing is required for the general fund budget that is in excess of the statutory 7 schedule amount, the trustees shall submit the proposition of an additional levy to raise such excess amount of general fund financing to the electors who are qualified under 10 20-20-301 to vote upon such proposition except that no 11 election shall be required to permit the school trustees to 12 13 use federal funds received under Title I of Public Law 81-874 to increase the school district's general fund budget 14 as established in 20-9-316 through 20-9-321 by the amount of 15 these funds. Such special election shall be called and 16 17 conducted in the manner prescribed by this title for school elections. The ballot for such election shall state the 18 19 amount of money to be raised by additional property taxation, the approximate number of mills required to raise 20 such money, and the purpose for which such money will be 21 22 expended, and it shall be in the following format: *PROPOSITION 23 24 Shall a levy be made in addition to the levies

- (4) If the election on any additional levy for the general fund is approved by a majority vote of those electors voting at such election, the proposition shall carry and the trustees may use any portion or all of the euthorized amount authorized for a particular school fiscal year for which the levy is authorized in adopting the preliminary general fund budget for that year. The trustees shall certify the additional levy amount authorized for that year by such a special election on the budget form that is submitted to the county superintendent, and the county commissioners shall levy such number of mills on the taxable value of all taxable property within the district, as prescribed in 20-9-141, as are required to raise the amount of such additional levy.
- (5) Authorization to levy an additional tax under the provisions of this section shall be effective for $\frac{1}{2}$

2 by a special election conducted before August 1 of the first school fiscal year for which it is effective. Only one such additional levy for the maintenance and operation of the school programs of a high school district may be imposed by 5 a high school district in a given school fiscal year . but this does not prevent such district from proposing such a levy to be effective for 2 years. The adoption of an additional levy to be effective for 2 years does not prevent 10 the trustees from proposing to increase such levy by 11 election pursuant to this section for the second year if 12 they consider that levy to be inadequate for the second 13 year." 14 Section 2.
