In compliance with a written request received February 3, $19 \frac{81}{1000}$, $19 \frac{81}{1000}$, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note
for House Bill 537 pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA).
Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members
of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would create a five year statute of limitations on actions to enforce a statutory debt created by the payment of public assistance.

IMPACT

It is impossible to determine the fiscal impact of this proposal. There is an increasing number of statutory debts created by payment of public assistance, (for example: AFDC) while the number of individuals working in the collections area has remained relatively fixed. The result is a growing backlog of cases in each of which an action must be brought within two years or the power to collect the debt is lost. A debtor has an opportunity to avoid his debt simply because his case is not processed in a timely fashion. The extension of the length of the period would make this outcome less likely.
