In compliance with a written request received February 3, 19 81, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for House Bill 544 pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

Description of Proposed Legislation

This is an act to remove the paid leave benefit for state, county, and municipal employees for the Annual National Guard encampment.

Assumptions


1. 375 members of the National Guard are employed by the political subdivisions covered by this bill. 153 are state employees.
2. An average of \$200 per week for two weeks is used to compute savings to the political subdivisions.

Fiscal Impact

The state would save \$61,200 in wages currently paid to people who attend National Guard encampment. Not all this money is from general funds but the amount from general fund cannot be computed at this time because the data is not readily available.

Local Impact

Political subdivisions other than the state would save \$88,800 in wages currently paid to people who attend National Guard encampment.
