(2) A person convicted of the offense of unlawful я transactions with children shall be fined not to exceed \$500 9 10 or be importanted in the county fail for any term not to exceed 6 months, or both. A person convicted of a second 11 offense of unlawful transactions with children shall be 12 13 fined not to exceed \$1,000 or be imprisoned in the county lail for any term not to exceed 6 months, or both.* 14 -End-
