5 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY  
6 FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS FOR THE BIENNIUM ENDING JUNE 30, 1993;  
7 PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO THE APPROPRIATIONS;  
8 AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

9  
10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11 Section 1. Definitions. For the purposes of this act,  
12 unless otherwise stated the following definitions apply:

13 (1) "Agency" includes each state office, department,  
14 board, commission, council, committee, unit of the  
15 university system, or other entity or instrumentality of the  
16 executive branch, office of the legislative branch, or  
17 office of the judicial branch of state government.

18 (2) "Capital project" means acquisition of land or  
19 improvements, planning, capital construction, renovation,  
20 furnishing, or major repair projects authorized in this act.

21 (3) "Approved budget amendment" means approval by the  
22 budget director of a request submitted through the  
23 architecture and engineering division of the department of  
24 administration to transfer excess funds appropriated to a  
25 capital project within an agency in order to increase the

1 appropriations of another capital project within that agency  
2 or to obtain financing to expand a project with funds which  
3 were not available for consideration by the legislature.

4 (4) "BPICA" means account number 06142 in the bond  
5 proceeds and insurance clearance fund; "FPRA" means federal  
6 and private revenue account; "ERA" means earmarked revenue  
7 account; and "other appropriated funds" means money other  
8 than general fund or BPICA money that accrues under  
9 provisions of law to an agency indicated herein.

10 Section 2. Expansion required to be authorized. No  
11 existing capital project may be expanded beyond the scope of  
12 the project as approved by the 47th Legislature unless the  
13 capital project expansion is authorized by an approved  
14 budget amendment.

15 Section 3. Additional funding. If a capital project is  
16 jointly financed by an appropriation or appropriations from  
17 state sources as well as by appropriations from other  
18 sources, the funds provided by appropriation from state  
19 sources shall be decreased by the amount that the funds  
20 received from other sources exceed the amount appropriated  
21 by the legislature if the decrease does not jeopardize the  
22 receipt of the funds to be received from other sources.

23 Section 4. Federal funds for administration. All  
24 federal funds received as a reimbursement for the cost of  
25 administering the federal funds when the cost was financed

1 from the general fund shall revert to the general fund.

2 Section 5. Reappropriation. Notwithstanding any other  
3 provision of law, the remaining balances on capital projects  
4 previously appropriated are hereby reappropriated until June  
5 30, 1983, for the purposes for which originally  
6 appropriated.

7 Section 6. Construction and maintenance appropriation.
