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(3) A nonresident licensee who violates any provision of his license, including the provision requiring an annual report, is subject to a fine by the commissioner of up to \$10,000 for each such violation and may, at the discretion of the commissioner, have his Montana nonresident license revoked or suspended for a period of up to ±0 5 years.

(4) Any insurer who issues a policy on a subject or risk located or to be performed in the state of Montana through a nonresident licensee shall pay a premium tax on such policy to the state of Montana.
