Section 1. Definition. As used in this 13 part, "department" means the department of social and 14 rehabilitation services. NEW SECTION. Section 2. Purpose. It is the purpose of 15 16 this part to develop a statewide planning and service 17 program on aging in order to: 18 (1) secure and maintain maximum independence and dignity in a home environment for older persons capable of 19 self-care with appropriate supportive services; and 20

administer the statewide planning and service programs on aging, pursuant to the Older Americans Act of 1965, 42 U-S-C- sections 3001 through 3053, as amended.

- (2) The department shall administer any federal funds granted to it as the sole state area agency on aging.
- (3) Pursuant to federal requirements, the department shall develop the state plan to be submitted to the United States commissioner of the administration on aging.

NEW SECTION. Section 4. Cooperation and compliance with federal requirements authorized. (1) The department shall cooperate with the federal government in carrying out the purposes of this part and, to this end, shall adopt such methods of administration as are found by the federal government to be necessary for the proper and efficient operation of the statewide programs on aging.

- (2) The department is authorized to comply with such requirements as may be necessary to obtain federal funds in the maximum amount and most advantageous proportion possible.
- NEW SECTION. Section 5. Adoption of rules. (1) The department shall adopt by rule a formula for distributing money to the counties.
