Section 1. Voluntary checkoff for 10 nongame wildlife management. (1) Each individual taxpayer 11 who is required to file an income tax return under Title 15, 12 chapter 30, may contribute to the funding of management of 13 nongame wildlife in Montana by marking the appropriate box

15 on the state income tax return.

(2) Each Montana state individual income tax return 16 17 form shall contain a provision for indicating a contribution 13 the nongame wildlife program in substantially the to. 19 following form:

20 Montana nongame wildlife program funding. Check the 21 appropriate blank if you wish to designate ____\$2, ____\$5, or **Z**2 ___\$10 of your tax refund, or if you are including ___\$2, 23 ____\$5, or ____\$10 in addition to the amount of tax owed, to 24 help fund the nongame wildlife program in Montana. On a 25 joint return, check the appropriate blank if your spouse

wishes to contribute ___\$2, ___\$5, or ___\$10 for the same purpose. (3) Money received under this section shall be deposited in the nongame wildlife account created b٧ [section 7]. Section 2. Section 87-5-102, MCA, is amended to read: #87-5-102. Définitions. As used in this part, the following definitions apply: (1) "Account" means the nongame wildlife account established in [section 71. tty(2) "Ecosystem" means a system of living organisms and their environment, each influencing the existence of the other and both necessary for the maintenance of life. 14 +2+13) "Endangered species" means any species or 15 subspecies of wildlife actively threatened with extinction 16 due to any of the following factors: 17 (a) the destruction, drastic modification, or severe 18 curtailment of its habitat; 19 (b) its overutilization for scientific, commercial, or 20 sporting purposes; 21 (c) the effect on it of disease, pollution, or 22 predation: 23 (d) other natural or man-made factors affecting its 24 prospects of survival or recruitment within the state; or

(e) any combination of the foregoing factors.

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1 (3)(4) "Management" means the collection and 2 application of biological information for the purposes of 3 increasing the number of individuals within species and 4 populations of wildlife up to the optimum carrying capacity 5 of their habitat and maintaining such levels. The term 6 includes the entire range of activities that constitute a 7 modern scientific resource program including but not limited 8 to research, census, law enforcement, habitat acquisition 9 and improvement, and education. Also included within the 10 term, when and where appropriate, is the periodic or total 11 protection of species or populations as well as regulated 12 taking.

21 (5)(1) "Optimum carrying capacity" means that point at
22 which a given habitat can support healthy populations of
23 wildlife species, having regard to the total ecosystem,
24 without diminishing the ability of the habitat to continue
25 that function.

9 <u>NEW_SECTION</u>. Section 3. Montana nongame wildlife 10 council. (1) There is a Montana nongame wildlife council.

(2) The council consists of five members, four of whom
 shall be appointed by the governor and the fifth who shall
 be chosen by the other four members.

14 (3) The members appointed shall be chosen as follows:
15 (a) two members from the membership of nonprofit
16 agricultural organizations; and

17 (b) two members from the membership of nonprofit
18 wildlife conservation organizations.

19 (4) Members shall serve 2-year terms.

(5) The council is allocated to the department of
fish, wildlife, and parks for administrative purposes only
as provided in 2-15-121.

23 (6) The council is not subject to the provisions of
 24 2-15-122, except as otherwise provided for in [section 4].
 25 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 4. Council meetings --

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requirements -- expenses -- procedures. (1) The council
 shall meet at least twice annually and shall also meet at
 other times at the request of the department or by the call
 of the chairman or a majority of the council members.

5 (2) The members are entitled to be paid for their 6 expenses in conducting council business as provided for in 7 2-15-122(5). Any expenses incurred by the council in the 8 conduct of council business shall be paid out of the nongame 9 wildlife account as provided for in [section 7].

10 (3) The council shall elect a chairman and any other
11 officers it considers necessary at its first meeting, after
12 July 1 of each year.

13 (4) A majority of the council constitutes a quorum to14 conduct business.

15 (5) All recommendations made and actions taken by the
16 council must be by majority vote of the quorum.

17 <u>NEW_SECTION</u> Section 5. Council responsibilities. The 18 council shall:

19 (1) advise the department generally as to the20 management of nongame wildlife;

(2) review and comment upon specific proposals by the
 department for nongame wildlife management;

23 (3) propose to the department rules and activities
24 affecting nongame wildlife management;

25 (4) solicit and assess public comments concerning

nongame wildlife management; and 1 (5) prepare for the public and the legislature a 2 biennial report on the nongame wildlife program. 3 NEW_SECTION. Section 6. Department to consult with 4 5 council. (1) The director and the department shall consult 6 with the council: (a) before adopting any regulations as provided for in 7 8 87-5-105 and 87-5-110; (b) before establishing any programs as provided for 9 in 87-5-108; or 10 11 (c) in adopting any policies for the implementation of 12 the nongame wildlife program. 13 (2) The director and the department shall seek to implement and revise any proposed regulations, programs, and 14 policies in accordance with the recommendations of the 15 16 council. (3) The director and the department shall consider for 17 adoption or implementation any regulations, policies, or 18 19 activities proposed by the council. NEW_SECTION. Section 7. Nongame wildlife account. (1) 20 21 There is a nongame wildlife account in the earmarked revenue fund provided for in 17-2-102. 22 23 (2) All money collected under [section 1] shall be

24 deposited in the account.25 (3) Money in the account shall be used by the

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department to provide adequate funding for the nongame
 wildlife program provided for in this part. The money is
 available to the department in the same manner as provided
 in 87-1-601.

5 NEW_SECTION. Section 8. Report. The department shall 6 report in detail to the house taxation committee during the 7 1983 session of the legislature the results of any program 8 utilizing money from the nongame wildlife account and shall 9 list in detail how the money collected was used.

Section 9. Codification instruction. (1) Section 1 is
 intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 15,
 chapter 30, and the provisions of Title 15, chapter 30,
 apply to section 1.

14 (2) Section 3 is intended to be codified as an
15 integral part of Title 2, chapter 15, part 34.

16 (3) Sections 4 through 8 are intended to be codified
17 as an integral part of Title 87, chapter 5, part 1, and the
18 provisions of Title 87, chapter 5, part 1, apply to sections
19 4 through 8.

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
