BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Biennial appropriation. There is appropriated from the constitutional trust fund earnings account to the credit of the highway reconstruction trust account the following funds:

Fiscal Year 1982 - \$12,000,000 Fiscal Year 1983 - \$13,000,000

Section 2. Continuing appropriation. Beginning July 1, 1983, and ending on June 30, 1993, there is appropriated to the credit of the highway reconstruction trust fund account 77% of the aarnings of the constitutional trust fund earnings account to be expended by the department of highways for the purposes stated in section 3.

Section 3. Expenditure of appropriated funds. (1) The funds appropriated to the highway reconstruction trust fund account shall be expended by the department of highways for the reconstruction of highways on the primary and secondary

systems.

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- (2) The department of highways shall expend these funds on reconstruction projects to straighten, widen, or make major improvements to the base of the highway or make major improvements in grades or curves. The funds may not be expended for routine repairs.
- (3) The department of highways shall expend the funds on projects throughout the state according to need and not on the basis of 60-3-203.
