HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 10

2 INTRODUCED BY John L. Johnson

4 A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF
5 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA REQUESTING AN
6 INTERIM STUDY OF ALTERNATIVES TO THE MONTANA PROPERTY TAX.

8 WHEREAS, of all the taxes imposed by the State of
9 Montana on its citizens, the property tax is always the most
10 controversial at every legislative session; and

11 WHEREAS, the property tax system is particularly
12 inequitable to senior citizens and others owning property
13 and living on a fixed income; and

14 WHEREAS, the reclassification of property by the 46th
15 Legislature did not eliminate the controversy or inequities;
16 and

17 WHEREAS, a system of taxation that discriminates
18 against property owners creates an onerous burden on the
19 incentive to own property, which ownership privilege is one
20 of the fundamental rights guaranteed by our Constitution and
21 is one of the cornerstones of our free enterprise system.

23 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
24 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

25 That in accordance with section 5-5-217, MCA, the

1 Legislative Council shall assign a joint subcommittee to:
2 (1) determine alternative methods of raising revenue
3 to replace property tax revenue;
4 (2) determine the feasibility of such methods in terms
5 of partially or completely replacing the property tax; and
6 (3) report the findings of the study to the 48th
7 Legislature and, if necessary, draft legislation to
8 implement its recommendations.

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a sales tax is not to be
10 considered as an alternative.

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
