BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Revenue Oversight Committee present its findings and recommendations to the Legislature prior to the convening of the 1983 Legislature.

In compliance with a written request received <u>January 24</u>, 19 81, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>House Joint Resolution 14</u> pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION

A joint resolution of the Senate and the House of Representatives of the state of Montana requesting the revenue oversight committee to investigate the advantages of replacing property taxation with a personal income tax to fund public elementary and high schools.

FISCAL IMPACT

The proposed joint resolution should not have a fiscal impact during the biennium. There may be costs involved in studying the issue, but those cannot be estimated at this time. The study proposed by this measure will not increase the legislature's expenditures because the committee will work the study in with its other duties during the interim.
