HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 20 1 INTRODUCED BY Menahan 2 3 A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF 4 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA REQUESTING AN 5 6 INTERIM STUDY OF THE CURRENT OVERALL FUNCTIONS AND STAFFING 7 OF THE DEPARTMENT OF INSTITUTIONS TO DETERMINE THE 8 EFFECTIVENESS OF THE DELIVERY OF INSTITUTIONAL SERVICES BY THE STATE; AND REQUIRING A REPORT OF THE FINDINGS OF THE 9 STUDY TO THE LEGISLATURE. 10 11 12 WHEREAS, the primary responsibility of the Department 13 of Institutions is the administration and operation of the individual institutions located throughout the state under 14 its control; and 15 16 WHEREAS, from time to time there occur serious 17 complaints of inflexibility and insensitivity in the 18 adoption and application of regulations of those 19 institutions and programs by a central administrative office

20 removed from direct involvement with institutional clients. 21

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 23

24 That an appropriate interim committee be assigned to 25 study the current overall functions and staffing of the 1 Department of Institutions to determine:

2 (1) the adequacy and necessity of institutional 3 services presently provided;

(2) services not presently provided that may be 4 considered necessary; 5

(3) alternative methods of delivering necessary 6 institutional services, including but not limited to 7 consolidation and reorganization of present functions and 8 9 staff positions;

(4) whether the necessary functions of the central 10 administrative office are being performed in the most 11 efficient, effective, and responsive manner possible. 12

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the committee report the 13 findings of the study to the 48th Legislature and, if 14 its necessary, draft legislation to implement 15 16 recommendations.
