5 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA URGING THE GOVERNOR
6 TO PROCLAIM THE WEEK BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 13, 1981, AS
7 MONTANA HISPANIC HERITAGE WEEK TO CORRESPOND WITH NATIONAL
8 HISPANIC HERITAGE WEEK.

10 WHEREAS, the Hispanic population in Montana continues
11 to grow; and

12 WHEREAS, the Hispanic people have played a significant
13 role in the history of the United States and Montana; and

14 WHEREAS, the Hispanic community has given us generals,
15 admirals, philosophers, statesmen, musicians, athletes, and
16 Nobel Prize-winning scientists; and

17 WHEREAS, Hispanic Americans have contributed gallantly
18 to the defense of our country; and

19 WHEREAS, outstanding Hispanic men and women contribute
20 daily to improve the quality of our lives; and

21 WHEREAS, Hispanics exhibit an eminent pride in our
22 American heritage, a passionate love of family, a profound
23 devotion to religion, and an energetic commitment to hard
24 work.

1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
2 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

3 That the Legislature strongly urges the Governor of the
4 State of Montana to proclaim the week beginning September
5 13, 1981, as Montana Hispanic Heritage Week to correspond
6 with National Hispanic Heritage Week and to encourage state
7 and local officials to observe this week with appropriate
8 activities and to seek innovative ways for government to
9 work in partnership with the Hispanic community.
