NOW, THEREFORE, SE IT RESOLVED BY THE SERATE AND THE HOUSE

That an appropriate interim committee be assigned to study the Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the study include at least the following: (1) a review of the organizational structure of the Department: (2) a review of the possibility of better usage of the current staff and the attendant cost savings; (3) an analysis of the Department's land holdings and long-range plans for additional acquisitions and for financing to provide for the maintenance of the acquired property; and (4) a review of the accounting methods and procedures used by the Department. SE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the committee prepare a report of its findings and conclusions, together with its recommendations, and provide the report to the 1983 Legislature no later than January 10, 1983. -End-
