10	WHEREAS, ever-increasing numbers of administrative
11	rules have been adopted by most executive agencies; and
12	WHEREAS, those agencies with administrative and
13	regulatory duties relating to the natural environment and
14	natural resources have been among the agencies adopting a
15	proliferation of administrative rules; and
16	WHEREAS, the wise use and regulation of the state's
17	environment and natural resources are important priorities
18	to the Legislature; and
19	WHEREAS, other states have adopted laws providing for
20	the termination or "sunset" of certain administrative rules;
21	and
22	WHEREAS, the use, management, and regulation of the
23	state's environment and natural resources may well benefit
24	from a "sunset" type of review of the administrative rules
25	of those agencies with duties relating to the environment

1 and natural resources: and 2 WHEREAS, the current laws requiring legislative review by the Legislative Audit Committee do not put sufficient emphasis on the review of administrative rules adopted by those executive agencies with duties relating to the management of the environment and natural resources. 7 8 NOW. THEREFORE. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 9

That an appropriate interim committee be assigned to study the procedures and methods that might be used to terminate or replace, or both, the rules that, in the judgment of the committee, affect the environment and natural resources of this state. In conducting the study, the committee shall review any laws adopted by other states, and the administration of those laws, providing for "sunset" termination of agency regulations and estimate the potential costs and benefits to this state of adopting laws requiring "sunset" termination of rules affecting the environment and natural resources of this state.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the committee report the findings of the study to the 48th Legislature and, if necessary, draft legislation implement its recommendations.
