In compliance with a written request received <u>January 7</u>, <u>19 81</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>Senate Bill 4</u> pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 4 establishes a weed research and education program within the Agricultural Experiment Station and the Cooperative Extension Service of Montana State University. It establishes a weed research and education advisory committee and provides for a tax levy of 2 mills on agricultural and timber land for the purpose of funding research and education to improve weed control and management. An immediate effective date is provided with a terminiation date of July 1, 1991.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The property valuation of agricultural and timber land will grow at a rate of 4-5% per year.
- 2. The 2 mill-levy equals \$292,462 for 1980-81.
