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24 25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Application for assistance — assignment of support rights. (1) Applications for public assistance, including but not limited to aid to dependent children and medical assistance, must be made to the county department of public welfare in the county in which the person is residing. The application shall be submitted, the manner and form prescribed by the department, and shall contain information required by the department.

(2) Effective at the time of application, a person by signing an application for public assistance, assigns to the department and to the county welfare department all rights the applicant may have to support and medical payments from any other person in his own behalf or in behalf of any other family member for whom application is made.

(3) The assignment:
