Section 1. Section 76-3-501, MCA, is amended to read: "76-3-501. Local subdivision regulations. [11] Before July 1: 1974: the governing body of every county; city: and town shall adopt and provide for the enforcement and administration of subdivision regulations reasonably providing the orderly development jurisdictional areas; for the coordination of roads within subdivided land with other roads, both existing and planned; for the dedication of land for roadways and for public utility easements; for the improvement of roads; for the provision of adequate open spaces for travel, light, air, and recreation; for the provision of adequate transportation, water, drainage, and sanitary facilities: for the avoidance or minimization of congestion; and for the avoidance of subdivision which would involve unnecessary

1 environmental degradation and the avoidance of danger of injury to health, safety, or welfare by reason of natural hazard or the lack of water, drainage, access, transportation, or other public services or necessitate an excessive expenditure of public funds for the supply of such services. 7 12) Local subdivision regulations shall require 8 subdividers to construct and maintain fences around 9 subdivisions in areas where interaction between livestock 10 and residents of the subdivision could reasonably be 11 expected to occur and result in damage to livestock and

Section 1. Fencing of improved real property adjacent to agricultural land or a municipality. A person who possesses and who constructs or uses any improvements upon real property that was, prior to such improvements, classified as agricultural land for tax purposes and is also adjacent to land that is classified and used as agricultural land or that is adjacent to the boundary of an incorporated city or town is responsible for constructing and maintaining a legal fence encompassing BETNEEN his improved real property AND ANY ADJACENT PROPERTY STILL USED FOR AGRICULTURAL PURPOSES. If that person fails to construct or

- 1 maintain such a fence, his failure is a defense against the
- 2 claim of any person for damages to such improved real
- 3 property caused by trespassing livestock.
