 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

12 Section 1. Section 2-6-212, MCA, is amended to read:

13 "2-6-212. Disposal of public records. ~~(1) Requests for~~
 14 ~~the disposal of public records shall be submitted to the~~
 15 ~~state records committee by the agency concerned. No~~ Except
 16 as provided in subsection (2), no public record may be
 17 disposed of or destroyed without the unanimous approval of
 18 the state records committee. When approval is required, a
 19 request for the disposal or destruction must be submitted to
 20 the state records committee by the agency concerned.

21 (2) The state records committee may, by unanimous
 22 approval, establish categories of records for which no
 23 disposal request is required, providing those records are
 24 retained for the designated retention period."

5 The intent is to have the State Records Committee
6 create by rule categories of records of minor importance for
7 which agencies would be relieved of the burden of
8 repetitively submitting disposal requests; for example:

9 (a) motor vehicle applications that are being
10 microfilmed

11 (b) inactive teacher certification records that are
12 being microfilmed

13 (c) interstate invoices in the state-wide budget and
14 accounting system.
