DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill No. 189 proposes a constitutional amendment to provide that the Legislature would meet in annual sessions for 8 consecutive six-day weeks.

ASSUMPTIONS:

If approved by the people, the amendment would become effective July 1, 1983, and the first annual session would be held in 1984.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There would be no impact in the fiscal 82 -- 83 biennium.

In the biennia following 1983, there would be a possible increase in cost of the additional six legislative days each biennium that this amendment would provide. That would be a potential additional cost of between \$72,000 and \$78,000 additional 1981 dollars in those years.
