A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO CREATE THE POSITION OF PUBLIC DEFENSE COORDINATOR; TO PROVIDE FOR THE COORDINATOR'S APPOINTMENT, QUALIFICATIONS, REMOVAL, SALARY, STAFF, AND DUTIES; AND TO PROVIDE FOR A COUNTY CONTRIBUTION TO THE COSTS OF THE COORDINATOR'S SERVICES."

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35 IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Definition of coordinator. For the purposes

of [this act] "coordinator" means the public defense

coordinator provided for in [section 2].

Section 2. Position established. (1) There is a public defense coordinator.

- (2) The office of the coordinator is allocated to the department of justice for administrative purposes only, as provided in 2-15-121, except that the provisions of subsections (1)(b), (1)(c), (2)(a), (2)(b), (2)(d), (2)(e), and (3)(a) of 2-15-121 do not apply.
- Section 3. Appointment. The coordinator shall be appointed by the governor from a list of three names submitted by the chief justice of the supreme court.
- Section 4. Qualifications. The coordinator shall be an attorney in good standing admitted to practice law in

- 1 Montana who has engaged in the active practice of law for at
- 2 least 2 years before his appointment.
- Section 5. Removal from office. The coordinator may be
   removed from office by the governor only for cause.
- Section 6. Salary. The salary of the coordinator shall be fixed by the governor and shall be commensurate with that of the training coordinator employed by the department of justice.
- 9 Section 7. Additional attorneys and staff. The 10 coordinator may hire one or more attorneys and the office 11 staff that he considers necessary to assist him in 12 performing his duties.
- Section 8. Duties of coordinator. The coordinator
  shall:
- 15 (1) provide for and coordinate training of public 16 defenders and court-appointed counsel in current aspects of 17 criminal law:
- 18 (2) plan for the future provision of public defense19 services in Montana;
- 20 (3) consolidate and provide such resources as official
  21 opinions, legal briefs, and other relevant criminal law
  22 information;

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(4) assist public defenders and court-appointed defense counsel in the prosecution of direct appeals to the supreme court whenever the requirements of his other duties and budgetary considerations allow;

- (5) act as trial counsel whenever the requirements of his other duties and budgetary considerations allow and, upon the request of the county commissioners, be appointed as such by a district judge in any criminal case that is expected to be so complicated or prolonged as to place an unreasonable burden on the county responsible for providing counsel by the usual means; and
- (6) apply for, accept, and disburse any federal funds available for aid to give fuller and more efficient realization of the right to counsel.
  - Section 9. County's contribution to costs of defense. Whenever the coordinator acts as defense counsel under subsection (4) or (5) of [section 8], the county responsible for providing counsel shall pay into the earmarked revenue fund for the use of the coordinator's affice an hourly compensation, agreed upon by the coordinator and the county commissioners of the responsible county, for the services of the coordinator or his assistant.

#### DESCRIPTION:

An act to create the position of public defense coordinator, to provide for the coordinator's appointment, qualifications, removal, salary, staff, and duties, and to provide for a county contribution to the costs of the coordinator's services.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The public defense coordinator program will operate in the same manner as the County Prosecutor Services, presently in the Department of Justice.
- 2. No revenue projections were made because the bill allows hourly compensation to be agreed upon by the coordinator and the county commissioners. This could not be projected.
