BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Conducting pupil-instruction days before Labor Day -- reduction in annual apportionment entitlement. Any district that conducts pupil-instruction days before Labor Day, the first Monday in September, is not entitled to receive school equalization apportionment funds for those days. If the district fails to conduct the minimum 180 school days required for entitlement of equalization apportionment after Labor Day but otherwise conducts 180 days or more for the school year, the superintendent of public instruction shall reduce the equalization apportionment of the district for the year by 1/180th for each pupil-instruction day conducted before Labor Day.

Section 2. Codification instruction. Section 1 is intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 20. chapter 1, part 3, and the provisions of Title 20 apply to
