Section 1. Section 23-1-102, MCA, is amended to read: 9 *23-1-102. Powers and duties of department of fish: 10 11 wildlife, and parks. The department shall make a study to 12 determine the scenic, historic, archaeologic, scientific, 13 and recreational resources of the state and may by purchase, 14 lease, agreement, or acceptance of donations,---or 15 condemnation acquire for the state any areas, sites, or 16 objects which in its opinion should be held, improved, and 17 maintained as state parks, state recreational areas, state 18 monuments, or state historical sites. The department may in 19 its discretion accept in the name of the state, in fee or 20 otherwise, any areas, sites, or objects conveyed, entrusted, 21 donated, or devised to the state. It may in its discretion 22 accept gifts, grants, bequests, or contributions of money or 23 other property to be spent or used for any of the purposes 24 of this part. A contract may not be entered into or other 25 obligation incurred until moneys have been appropriated by

the legislature or are otherwise available. The department 1 also has jurisdiction, custody, and control of all state 2 3 parks, recreational areas, public camping grounds, 4 historical sites, and monuments, except wayside camps and other public conveniences acquired, improved, and maintained 5 by the department of highways and contiguous to the state 6 highway system. Deposits 7 shall be returned to the unsuccessful bidders except bidders 8 9 defaulting after notification.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of 18-4-102, the 18 department, with the consent of the commission, is 19 20 authorized to utilize the installment contract method to facilitate the acquisition of wildlife management areas, in 21 which game and nongame fur-bearing animals and game and 22 23 nongame birds may breed and replenish, and areas which 24 provide access to fishing sites for the public. In no case may the total cost of such installment contracts exceed the 25
