4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO REMOVE THE AUTOMATIC
 5 EXCLUSION OF STUDENTS FROM THE RECEIPT OF UNEMPLOYMENT
 6 BENEFITS AND TO PROVIDE THAT WITH APPROVAL OF SCHOOLING BY
 7 THE DIVISION, OTHERWISE ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS ATTENDING
 8 SCHOOL SHALL RECEIVE UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS; AMENDING SECTION
 9 39-51-2307, MCA."

 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

12 Section 1. Section 39-51-2307, MCA, is amended to

In compliance with a written request received 2/9 19 81, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB 378 pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA).

Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

Description of proposed legislation:

"AN ACT TO REMOVE THE AUTOMATIC EXCLUSION OF STUDENTS FROM THE RECEIPT OF UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS AND TO PROVIDE THAT WITH APPROVAL OF SCHOOLING BY THE DIVISION, OTHERWISE ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS ATTENDING SCHOOL SHALL RECEIVE UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS; AMENDING SECTION 39-51-2307, MCA."

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Assume that percent distribution of students with earnings to total employment will be the same for FY 1982 and FY 1983 as in the 1970 census.
2. Assume students average annual wage will be 60% of all other employment as in 1970 census.
3. Assume students average weekly benefit amount will be 60% of all other claimants.
4. Assume students average benefit duration will be the same as for all other claimants or 12.5 weeks.
5. Based on assumption #1 there will be approximately 35,000 students with earnings for FY 1982 and FY 1983.
6. Assume that the percent of students who will potentially draw benefits under the proposed law will be the same ratio as for all other claimants which is 13% based on historical data.
7. Based on above assumptions there will potentially be 4,550 student claimants for each of FY 1982 and FY 1983 under the proposed law.
8. Based on assumption #3 the average weekly benefit amount for students will be \$57.45 for FY 1982 and \$63.00 for FY 1983.
