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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT JOARDS ALLOCATED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL LICENSING HAVE THE AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMS AND REQUIREMENTS TO INSURE MAINTENANCE OF PROFESSIONAL KNOWLEDGE AND COMPETENCY OF LICENSEES." MHEREAS, during the course of its sunset audits, the Legislative Audit Committee noted that a number of professional and occupational licensing boards do not have the authority to establish continuing education programs or requirements; and

16 WHEREAS, continuing education is in the public interest 17 to insure maintenance of professional knowledge and 18 competency of licensees.

19 THEREFORE, it is the intent of this act to provide to 20 all licensing boards in the department of professional and 21 occupational licensing the authority to establish continuing 22 education programs and requirements.

24BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:25Section 1. Continuing education requirements by

1 licensing boards. Each board allocated to the department of 2 professional and occupational licensing may establish by 3 rule continuing education programs and continuing education 4 requirements. Compliance with continuing education 5 requirements may be used as a condition of continued 6 licensure. In adopting rules and individual orders regarding 7 continuing education, such a board, in its discretion:

8 (1) may use or rely upon guidelines and pronouncements
9 of recognized educational and professional associations;

10 (2) may prescribe the content, duration, and
11 organization of courses;

12 (3) shall take into account the accessibility to
13 applicants of such continuing education as it may require;
14 and

15 (4) shall avoid any impediments to interstate practice
16 that may result from differences in continuing education
17 requirements in other states.

Description of Proposed Legislation

An act to provide that boards allocated to the Department of Professional and Occupational Licensing have the authority to establish continuing education programs and requirements to insure maintenance of professional knowledge and competency of licensees.

Assumptions

- 1. 24 of the boards currently have no continueing education requirement.
- 2. The cost of implementing a continuing education program could not be absorbed in these boards' current budgets. Therefore, boards interested in implementing such a program would have to seek a budget modification from the legislation.
- 3. The cost of continuing education programs would vary from board to board.
- 4. The cost of the continuing education programs will be paid from each board's earmarked account.

Fiscal Impact

It is not possible to estimate the fiscal impact since the number of boards that will implement a continuing education program, the cost of the program, and when it would begin is unknown.

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5 A statement of intent is required for this bill in that 6 it delegates rulemaking authority to the various licensing 7 boards within the Department of Professional and 8 Occupational Licensing.

9 This bill grants the various licensing boards within 10 the Department of Professional and Occupational Licensing 11 the authority to establish continuing education programs and requirements to insure maintenance of professional knowledge 12 13 and competency of licensees. It is the intent of the 14 Legislature that the continuing education programs have as 15 their primary objective the protection of the health, safety, and welfare of the public, and, that the programs 16 not serve primarily to limit entry into the profession or 17 18 occupation or to promote the personal interests of the 19 licensees.
