A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: MAN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR SENATE 5 6 CONFIRMATION OF MEMBERS OF THE BOARDS OF COUNTY PRINTING. DENTISTRY. OSTEOPATHIC PHYSICIANS, PODIATRY EXAMINERS, 7 PHARMACISTS. NURSING. NURSING HOME ADMINISTRATORS, OPTOMETRISTS, CHIROPRACTORS, RADIOLOGIC TECHNOLOGISTS. 9 SPEECH PATHOLOGISTS AND AUDIOLOGISTS, HEARING AID 10 DISPENSERS. VETERINARIANS, 11 PSYCHOLOGISTS. BARBERS: 12 COSMETOLOGISTS. MASSAGE THERAPISTS, PHYSICAL THERAPY 13 EXAMINERS. SANITARIANS. LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTS. 21 WHEREAS, the Legislative Audit Committee has completed
22 its review of regulatory and licensing boards under the
23 first two sunset cycles; and
24 WHEREAS, it was noted that appointments to many
25 regulatory and licensing boards are not subject to Senate

confirmation; and

WHEREAS, Senate confirmation provides an opportunity

for input to the appointment process by members of the
regulated trade, profession, or industry and by the public,
which is in the public interest.

THEREFORE, it is the intent of this act to provide for
Senate confirmation of members of regulatory and licensing

12 "2-15-1102. Board of county printing -- composition -13 allocation -- compensation. (1) There is a board of county
14 printing.

15 (2) The board consists of five members appointed by 16 the governor with the consent of the senate for terms of 2 17 years.

18 (3) The members are:

20 (b) two county commissioners;

21 (c) one member of the general public.

22 (4) The board is allocated to the department for

The Montana dental association and the Montana dental hygienists association shall each present to the governor, within 15 days after its regular annual meeting, a list of not less than five candidates from which appointments for vacancies on the board occurring during the ensuing year may be made. At all times at least three members of the board shall be appointed from the list of candidates submitted by the Montana dental association and one member shall be appointed from the list submitted by the Montana dental hygienists association. Each member shall be licensed to practice a dental profession in this state, shall have actively practiced in this state for at least 5 continuous years immediately before his appointment, and shall be actively engaged in practice while serving on the board. Each member shall be a citizen of the United States and a resident of this state.
- (3) Each member shall serve for a term of 5 years. The governor may remove a member only for neglect or cause.
- (4) The governor shall fill any vacancy within 30 days.
