In compliance with a written request received <u>February 12</u>, 19 81, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>Senate Bill 444</u> pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

Description of Proposed Legislation

An act concerning the regulation, registration, and inspection of passenger tramways by the state, and providing an immediate effective date.

Assumption

If passed, the associated regulation, registration, and inspection activities would no longer be performed by the state and, therefore, no associated revenues would be collected or expenditures incurred.

The revenue figures presented assume normal snow years. In FY 1979, \$10,980 was collected and in FY 1980, \$11,719 was collected.
