Description of Proposed Legislation: "An act to permit the Department of Institutions to contract with public or private corporations for confinement of selected inmates; amending section 53-30-106, MCA."

### Assumptions:

- 1) This legislation merely provides a statutory basis for the Department of Institutions' existing arrangements with several community placement facilities for inmates.
- 2) This legislation expressly restricts its authorization to "within budgetary limits."

### Fiscal Impact:

We do not expect this legislation to have any impact on the Department of Institutions' revenues or expenditures.

#### Technical Note:

This legislation authorizes the Department of Institutions to contract with "public or private corporations," but does not mention any other forms of business entity. It is not clear whether or not this restriction is intended.
