In compliance with a written request received <u>February 13</u>, 19 <u>81</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>Senate Bill 456</u> pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

Description of Proposed Legislation

A proposal to continue the flow of State Equalization monies to non-isolated school districts the first year of their non-isolation.

Assumptions

- 1. There are 16 non-isolated schools of less than 10 ANB. This figure will remain constant.
- 2. Eleven schools of less than 10 ANB closed last year. This figure remains constant.
- 3. The Foundation Program will remain the same.

Expenditure Impact

11 school distrists x \$5,280.80 = \$58,088.80. \$58,000 each year of the biennium from the State General Fund.

Technical Note

Increases provided for foundation program support in the next biennium will increase the amount of General Fund required for financing this proposal.

When a school of nine or fewer pupils is approved as isolated under the provisions of 20-9-302, the county and state shall participate in the financing of the total amount of the foundation program.

(3) Funds provided to support the special education accounting budget may be expended only for special education purposes as approved by the superintendent of public instruction in accordance with the special education budgeting provisions of this title. Expenditures for special education shall be accounted for separately from the balance of the school district general fund. Transfers between items within the special education budget for accounting purposes may be made at the discretion of the board of trustees in accordance with the financial administration part of this title. The unexpended balance of the special education accounting budget shall carry over to the next year to reduce the amount of funding required to finance the district's ensuing year's maximum-budgetwithout-a-vote for special education."
