8 WHEREAS, the Montana Legislature has become 9 increasingly aware of the need to declare its support of the 10 original intent and role of the federal government as 11 formulated by the framers of the constitution; and

12 WHEREAS, it is increasingly apparent that over the past 13 20 years the federal government has manifested its inability 14 to control or resolve the economic fluctuations in our 15 marketplace; and

16 WHEREAS, the State of Montana desires to take its place 17 as a sovereign entity as established in the constitution and 18 fulfill its stewardship by taking charge of its future in 19 the responsible manner of which it is capable, thereby 20 relieving some of the unnecessary strain on the federal 21 government.

23 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE 24 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

25 That the Montana Legislature strongly urges the United

States Congress to present and support the "Liberty
 Amendment". The "Liberty Amendment" reads as follows:

*Section 1. The Government of the United States shall
not engage in any business, professional, commercial,
financial or industrial enterprise except as specified in
the Constitution.

7 "Section 2. The Constitution or laws of any State or
8 the laws of the United States shall not be subject to the
9 terms of any foreign or domestic agreement which would
10 abrogate this amendment.

11 "Section 3. The activities of the United States 12 Government which violate the intent and purpose of this 13 amendment shall, within a period of three years from the 14 date of the ratification of this amendment, be liquidated 15 and the properties and facilities affected shall be sold.

16 "Section 4. Three years after the ratification of this 17 amendment the sixteenth article of amendments to the 18 Constitution of the United States shall stand repealed and 19 thereafter Congress shall not levy taxes on personal 20 incomes, estates, and/or gifts."

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this body supports the 22 "Liberty Amendment" in intent and script.

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this body requests that 24 the Montana Congressional Delegation support the "Liberty 25 Amendment" as a tool to bring new life to our marketplace
