 5   A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF  
 6   REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA URGING THE CONGRESS  
 7   OF THE UNITED STATES TO REMOVE ALCOHOL FUEL PRODUCTION  
 8   PERMITS AND INFORMATION FROM THE CONFIDENTIALITY  
 9   REQUIREMENTS OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE AND URGING THE  
 10   BUREAU OF ALCOHOL, TOBACCO AND FIREARMS TO MAKE THIS  
 11   INFORMATION AVAILABLE.

 13       WHEREAS, The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms of  
 14   the United States Department of the Treasury interprets the  
 15   confidentiality provisions of Section 6103 of the Internal  
 16   Revenue Code to include alcohol fuel producer's permits and  
 17   related information; and

18       WHEREAS, availability of this information is of great  
 19   importance to the state of Montana in monitoring alcohol  
 20   fuel production in the state; and

21       WHEREAS, the confidentiality requirements of the  
 22   Internal Revenue Code place substantial administrative and  
 23   procedural burdens on state agencies seeking information.

 25   NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE

1   OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

2                   (1) That the Congress of the United States is urged to  
 3   remove the alcohol fuel producer's permit, the application  
 4   therefor, and other related nontax information from the  
 5   confidentiality provisions of the Internal Revenue Code.

6                   (2) That the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms  
 7   make the information described above available to interested  
 8   persons.

9                   (3) That copies of this resolution be sent by the  
 10   Secretary of State to the President of the Senate of the  
 11   United States, the Speaker of the House of Representatives  
 12   of the United States, the Montana Congressional Delegation,  
 13   and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms.
