whereas, the merger of some functions of the two hospitals is a concept with merit, although it is unclear how a merger could be planned and executed so that the resulting facility would have the ability to improve health care at an appropriate cost; and

MHEREAS, both the Department of Institutions and the administrators of the two hospitals have merger plans but none of the plans is sufficiently understood at this time to be adopted as the plan that can assure the best contribution to the health care needs of the patients and to the common good of the people of the State of Montana; and

WHEREAS, all of the appropriate parties have not had sufficient involvement to assure that a workable plan will

be adopted; and

WHEREAS, the health care needs of the prisoners at the state prison in Deer Lodge also might be addressed by a carefully studied mergar plan; and

WHEREAS, the Governor has declared his intention to help redevelop the Anaconda community, and the effect on employment in that area of any reorganization of Warm Springs and Galen state hospitals must be clearly understood by all affected parties prior to effecting such reorganization.

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NOH, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

That an appropriate interim committee be assigned to study the possibility of merging the state hospitals at Warm Springs and Galen and that the committee include in its study at least the following:

- (1) the feasibility of merging the two hospitals;
- (2) the fiscal impact of a merger;
- 20 (3) the effect on the numbers of employees at the two21 locations; and
- 22 (4) the possibility of providing health care for the 23 prisoners at the state prison in Deer Lodge through the 24 merged hospitals.
 - BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the interim committee

- submit to the 48th Legislature a report of its findings
 together with:
- (1) a recommendation to merge the two hospitals or toleave them separate;
- 5 (2) any recommendations for improvement of the quality 6 of health care or for decreasing inefficiency at the 7 hospitals; and
- (3) recommendations for legislation, if any, necessaryto implement its findings.
