JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 17 1 INTRODUCED BY a. Jacobion Treix Benun 2 Farindo 2 A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE нбизг 4 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA REPEALING 5 THE 6 STANDARD ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES FOR FLUORIDE ON FORAGE AND DIRECTING THE ADOPTION 7 з OF A NEW STANDARD.

HEREAS, section 75-2-202 authorizes the Board of
 Health and Environmental Sciences to establish ambient air
 quality standards for the state; and

13 HEREAS, following a thorough study of the need to 14 control fluoride levels in the ambient air and the control 15 technology available, the staff of the Department of health and Environmental Sciences recommended to the Board of 16 17 Health and Environmental Sciences that the Board set the 18 annual average standard for fluoride on forage at 35 19 micrograms per gram of forage and the monthly standard at 50 20 micrograms per gram of forage; and

21 WHEREAS, in spite of the recommendation made by its 22 staff, on July 18, 1980, the Board of Health and 23 Environmental Sciences adopted a monthly average of 20 24 micrograms of fluoride per gram of forage, which standard is 25 significantly more stringent and restrictive than the standard recommended by the staff; and

2 WHEREAS, there was competent evidence presented to the 3 Board showing that the Board's standard should be set at a 4 higher monthly average per gram of forage; and

5 WHEREAS, some industries that have made every attempt 6 to comply with past fluoride standards set by the Board are 7 now unable to develop any further control devices that would 8 enable the industries to meet the more restrictive standards 9 adopted by the Board; and

10 WHEREAS, the closure of these industries that could 11 result from the enforcement of the Board's standards would 12 be highly damaging to the economy of this state and would 13 prevent the manufacture of industrial products that are 14 valuable to the nation.

16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE

17 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

13That the rule adopted by the Board of Health and19Environmental Sciences setting the monthly standard for20fluoride on forage at 20 micrograms per gram of forage.21designated as Rule 16.8.813 of the Administrative Rules of22Montana, is repealed; and

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Health and
24 Environmental Sciences shall proceed within 30 days to adopt
25 a standard for fluoride on forage setting the annual average
