WHEREAS, there are seven area agencies on aging in Montana organized under the federal Older Americans Act; and WHEREAS, each agency is responsible for developing an area plan for resource development and delivery of services to older people; and

WHEREAS, opinion varies considerably among the seven area agencies and the older Montanans residing within those areas as to the accountability of, the cost effectiveness of, and the need for operating the local area agencies; and whereas, opinion indicates that certain area agencies are successful in maintaining efficient operations and providing meaningful and efficient implementation of services, while other area agencies are deficient in meeting

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NOW. THEREFORE. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE 1 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: That the Legislative Finance Committee is requested to study the efficiency of the seven area agencies on aging in Montana and their accountability to the people they serve. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Committee review the 7 efficiency and meaningfulness of the plans adopted by the area agencies and approved by the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services. 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Committee evaluate to 11 what extent meaningful cooperation exists between the area 12 agencies and their respective local government funding 13 sources. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Committee report its 14 15 findings and recommendations to the 48th Legislature.
