A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA URGING THE ASSIGNMENT TO AN APPROPRIATE INTERIM COMMITTEE OF A STUDY OF MONTANA'S CODE OF ETHICS FOR PUBLIC OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES AND ITS ADMINISTRATION AND EMFORCEMENT.

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WHEREAS, the Constitution of Montana requires in Article XIII, section 4: that the Legislature enact a code of ethics prohibiting conflict between public duty and private interest for members of the Legislature and all state and local officers and employees; and

WHEREAS, the people of Montana have overwhelmingly affirmed this constitutional principle as well as the principle of openness and integrity in government by their approval of initiative 85, the lobbyist disclosure initiative; and

WHEREAS, our government derives its power directly from the people, and a credible, effective government depends on maintaining the people's confidence and trust; and

WHEREAS, the 1977 Legislature, in acknowledgment of the need to encourage ethical conduct among public officers and employees, enacted a code of ethics; and
