A RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA TO RONALD REAGAN, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, THE COMMISSIONER OF THE UNITED STATES FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION, THE HONORABLE JOHN MELCHER, SENATOR FROM MONTANA, THE HONORABLE MAX BAUCUS, SENATOR FROM MONTANA, THE HONORABLE RON MARLENEE, CONGRESSMAN FROM THE SECOND CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT, THE HONORABLE PAT WILLIAMS, CONGRESSMAN FROM THE FIRST CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT, AND TED SCHWINDEN, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MONTANA, ENCOURAGING THEM TO HAVE RESCINDED A RESULATION OF THE FEDERAL FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION THAT WOULD CAUSE THE CLOSURE OF THE DEER LODGE RESEARCH UNIT WHICH CONDUCTS DRUG RESEARCH AT THE MONTANA STATE PRISON BECAUSE SUCH CLOSURE WOULD CAUSE GREAT ECONOMIC HARDSHIP FOR THE COMMUNITY OF DEER LODGE, MONTANA.

WHEREAS, since 1968 the Deer Lodge Research Unit has conducted pharmaceutical research at the Montana State Prison, Deer Lodge, Montana, on volunteer prison inmates; and

WHEREAS, the Deer Lodge Research Unit has 7.5 employees

l increase its annual payroll to \$200,000; and

2 WHEREAS, the Deer Lodge Research Unit is funded 3 exclusively by an ongoing grant established by 4 pharmaceutical companies and no taxpayer money is spent on 5 the research unit; and

WHEREAS, the Deer Lodge Research Unit is administered by the University of Montana, University Foundation, and there is an independent body which insures that all research conducted at the prison is conducted under the most safety-conscious considerations and that fully monitors the research to ensure that the inmate subjects are fully protected and are bona fide volunteers; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration has proposed a regulation at Volume 45, No. 106, page 36386, dated May 30, 1980, that would have foreclosed further research by the Deer Lodge Research Unit; and

WHEREAS, that regulation was to become effective on June 1, 1981, but because of an executive order by President Ronald Reagan requiring a reexamination of all federal regulations not yet effective to consider their economic consequences, the regulation's effective date has been indefinitely postponed.

Administration be advised that it is the desire of the Senate of the State of Montana that the administrative regulation foreclosing the type of pharmaceutical research conducted by the Deer Lodge Research Unit, Montana State Prison, Deer Lodge, Montana, be rescinded because of the economic detriment such rule would cause the community of Deer Lodge, Montana, and because the administration of the Deer Lodge Research Unit by the University of Montana, University Foundation, precludes any abuses that may have occurred in other states and which may be cured in another manner compatible with research currently conducted.

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(2) That the Secretary of the Senate send a copy of this resolution to Ronald Reagan, President of the United States, the Commissioner of the United States Food and Drug Administration, the Honorable John Melcher, Senator from Montana, the Honorable Max Baucus, Senator from Montana, the Honorable Ron Harlenee, Congressman from the Second Congressional District, the Honorable Pat Williams, Congressman from the First Congressional District, and Ted Schwinden, Governor of the State of Montana.
