All committees and councils authorized or funded by this act shall hold public hearings across the state to explain their activities and listen to the concerns of the local citizenry. Prior public notice is required for all regular meetings, reports, etc.

The councils, committees, and programs established in this act shall reflect a balance of varying economic perspectives, actively investigate and seek out innovative economic development programs, and offer a diverse array of options and strategies for public comment before adopting recommendations.
