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10	WHEREAS, the Montana Supreme Court adopted a rule on
11	June 29, 1981, on the disqualification and substitution of
12	judges, including a provision allowing each adverse party in
13	a civil case two substitutions of a judge; and
14	WHEREAS, Article VII, section 2, of the Montana
15	Constitution permits the Legislature to disapprove this rule
16	in either of the two sessions following promulgation; and
17	WHEPEAS, the Legislature finds in its review of this
18	rule that one peremptory challenge in a civil case is
19	sufficient but that two challenges are excessive and delay
20	the administration of justice; and
21	WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that its
22	constitutional powers are limited to disapproval, rather
23	than amendment, of a Supreme Court Rule.
24	THEREFORE, the Legislature seeks to eliminate
25	peremptory challenges in civil cases by disapproving in part

a civil case.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Partial disapproval of supreme court rule

on disqualification and substitution of judges. Under

Article VII. section 2. of the Montana constitution, the

legislature disapproves that provision within the supreme

court order dated June 29. 1981. on the disqualification and

substitution of judges that allows each adverse party in a
