DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 10 provides that the Training Coordinator for county attorneys may act as special council to a county; and requires the county to pay for these special counsel services.

FISCAL IMPACT:

None.

LOCAL IMPACT:

The Training Coordinator operates out of the County Prosecutors program. This program has supplied special counsel to counties for several years, charging \$30 per hour for the service. It is anticipated this service will continue at status quo for the coming biennium causing no additional impact to local governments.
