4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE USE OF
5	THE OLD MONTANA STATE PRISON; REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF
6	STATE LANDS TO NEGOTIATE FOR THE TERMINATION OF THE LEASE OF
7	THE OLD PRISON: ALLOWING THE WARDEN TO DETERMINE WHICH
8	PRISONERS TO INCARCERATE IN THE OLD PRISON; REQUIRING THE
9	OLD MONTANA STATE PRISON TO MEET CERTAIN STANDARDS;
10	APPROPRIATING MONEY FOR THE RENOVATION OF THE OLD PRISON;
11	AND PROVIDING AN INMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE.

13	WHEREAS, the Montana Territorial and State Prison was
14	listed in the National Register of Historic Places on
15	September 3, 1976; and
16	WHEREAS, since that time the prison has received
17	funding from the Federal Historic Preservation Fund which
18	required the signing of a 10-year covenant assuring the
19	general preservation of the structure; and
20	WHEREAS, the aforementioned covenant does not preclude
21	changes to the property, nor does it prevent the reuse of
22	the prison as a prison.

24	THEREFORE, it is the intent of this act that the

Montana Territorial and State Prison be renovated for use in

housing maximum security inmates.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
Section 1. Definitions. For the purposes of [this
act], unless otherwise stated, the following definitions
apply:
(1) "Capital project" means acquisition of land or
improvements, planning, capital construction, renovation,
furnishing, or major repair projects authorized in (this
act]•
(2) "BPICA" means account number 06142 in the bond
proceeds and insurance clearance fund; "FPRA" means federal
and private revenue account; "ERA" means earmarked revenue
account; and Mother appropriated funds means money other
than general fund or BPICA money that accrues under
provisions of law to an agency indicated herein.
(3) "Old prison" means the Montana territorial and
state prison, including all of blocks 52, 53, 62, 63, 66,
and 67 of the original townsite to the city of Deer Lodge.
Powell County. Montana.
Section 2. Termination of lease. The department of
state lands shall enter into negotiations with the city of
Deer Lodge to terminate the lease between the state of
Montana and the city of Deer Lodge concerning the old

INTRODUCED BILL

- Section 3. Use of old prison. (1) The old prison shall be used primarily for maximum security inmates. The warden of the Montana state prison may determine, for security reasons, which prisoners are to be incarcerated in the old prison.
- 6 (2) The old prison shall meet the minimum standards
 7 described as "Plan C" in <u>The Old Montana State Prison: A</u>
 8 <u>Renovation Equalibility Study</u> by The Parrish Architects,
 9 November 17, 1982.
 - Section 4. Severability. If a part of this act is invalid, all valid parts that are severable from the invalid part remain in effect. If a part of this act is invalid in one or more of its applications, the part remains in effect in all valid applications that are severable from the invalid applications.
- Section 5. General fund appropriation. There is

the Legislature upon request.
DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:
House Bill 22 proposes to renovate the Old Prison to be used for housing maximum security inmates.

ASSUMPTIONS:

The planning, bid and construction process will not be completed before the end of the 1984-85 Biennium.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There will be no fiscal impact for operating expenses during the 1984-85 Biennium.

COMMENTS:

The lease with the city of Deer Lodge for the Old Prison began in 1982 extending to 2005. The city pays \$5 per year for this lease.

LONG RANGE EFFECTS:

The estimate for the operating costs of the renovated old prison would be \$5.3 million in the 1986-87 biennium. In comparison, the Office of Budget and Program Planning and the Department of Institutions estimate that the construction of a new facility at the present prison site would require operating costs of only \$3,709,926 for the 1986-87 biennium, with 28.7 fewer FTE.
