regular school election day, the first Tuesday after the
first Menday of April November. Election of trustees shall
comply with the election provisions of Title 13 and this
title.

Section 4. Section 20-20-105, MCA, is amended to read:

"20-20-105. Regular school election day and special
school elections. The first Tuesday after the first Monday
of April November of each year shall be the regular school
election day. Unless otherwise provided by law, special
school elections may be conducted at such times as
determined by the trustees."

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NEW SECTION. Section 5. Transition of officers. Any municipal officer, officer of a political subdivision wholly within one county, or school district trustee holding office on July 1, 1983, is entitled to remain in office until his successor. Is qualified after the first election held pursuant to 13-1-104, as amended by section 1, following the completion of the term for which he was elected or appointed.

20 <u>MEM SECTION.</u> Section 6. Effective date. This act is 21 effective on July 1, 1983.

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
